## ELECTRONIC RECYCLING

With gift giving Holidays fast approaching (and clearing out the old), we wanted to remind everyone that Adams County Rescue Mission will now accept Electronics for Recycling and effective January 2012, Electronic Recycling will be required by Pennsylvania law. In a nutshell, if it has a cord or runs on batteries, it can no longer be disposed of in the trash in Pennsylvania effective January 2012. Adams County Rescue Mission also refurbishes items that may still be serviceable and requests that you attach manuals, remotes, etc. if you have them, so they can repair for reuse, if possible and recycle, if not. If there is enough interest in January, we can arrange for local drop off/ collection and we'll get volunteers to make a run to Adams County Rescue Mission. Information from Pennsylvania and Ad-

ams County Rescue Mission follows: The Adams Rescue Mission is excited to announce that we now accept electronics for recycling. In working with E-Loop LLC, which is licensed through PA and the DEP, your used electronics can be recycled instead of thrown away! We now accept **ANYTHING** with a cord that plugs into the wall, whether it works or not, and battery or remote control operated toys or electronics (please remove the batteries, as we do not recycle them). This includes items such as printers, copiers, cell phones, TV's, toys, curling irons, microwaves, toasters, computers and parts. Items we **CANNOT** accept include items with freon, gas, oil, or liquids, such as refrigerators, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, electric lawnmowers, or weed-wackers. Items can be dropped off at the North side of our building Mon-Sat between 8-4. Please take advantage of this great opportunity to recycle.
