

### Billiard League

The Links Billiard League will commence its fourth season on January 2, 2013. If you are a male resident of the Links, you are invited to participate. You do not need to be a pool shark. You don't even have to own a pool cue, let alone a table. The purpose of the League is to get together and have fun during the Winter months; the last night of League play is always the last Wednesday before daylight savings time begins. This season that means we will play for ten weeks ending on March 6th. We will play every Wednesday night at 7 pm. Play usually goes until 10 or so. Our game is doubles eight ball. Each player will partner with 3-4 other guys during the evening and will play 8-9 games. Play takes place at the homes of residents who own tables. The only caveat regarding participation is that you are able to play at least 5 of the ten nights. Also note that there is a singles double elimination tournament at the end of the season. This is optional. To participate in the tournament, you must have played at least 7 times during the regular season. Seeding in this tournament is based on the regular season record.

### Second Tuesday Group

The Second Tuesday Group meets on the second Tuesday of every month at 10:00 a.m. in the Community Center. It is a forum for discussions, conversations (more in-depth than most other Links social events afford), demonstrations, and sharing.

Having begun as the Links Ladies Craft Group, it is still a gathering where you will find some with needlework, knitting or other projects in hand. Everyone is welcome.
