HOA CORNER

Hello, neighbors! It's been a while since the last Links Newsletter. This might be a good time to provide some useful, basic information on our growing Links community, particularly for new residents.

Our Neighborhoods

The Links is currently made up of four different neighborhoods: Courtyards, the Retreat Condominium, Garrison Falls and Villas at the Retreat (including the Keystone homes). Most, but not all of these neighborhoods have established Home Owners Associations (HOAs). Representatives from the neighborhood HOAs sit on the Master Home Owners Association (MA) Executive Board and vote on issues that are governed by the MA. (See section below on Master Association.) In addition, under the neighborhood HOAs, there are Architectural Review Committees (ARCs) to provide guidelines and approve changes or improvements to the exterior of your house, including landscaping. The ARCs also oversee the use of common areas and public spaces. The ARC guidelines can be found online at <u>linkshoa.org</u> or in the hardcopy of the Public Offering Statement (POS) the homeowners received at time of settlement.

Community Center Update

The Master Association recently upgraded the equipment in the Community Center gym, including the purchase of a refurbished treadmill and an elliptical machine. Both pieces of workout gear were bought from an auction of pre-owned, excessed equipment from Ft. Detrick in Frederick, Md., thanks to Don Faust who brought the sale to the Board's attention. On these particular purchases, the MA consulted Tim Neal, a professional certified gym equipment maintenance person, who works at the YMCA. Tim Neal has refurbished the treadmill and is maintaining all the gym equipment at the Community Center. Tim's contact information is being added to the Links preferred vendors list.

Face of America

On April 24, 2016, Links residents poured out onto Mason-Dixon Road to honor hundreds of bike riders participating in the World Team Sports "Face of America", a 2-day bike ride from Washington D.C. to Gettysburg. This is the 8th year that the Links has supported this special event to honor veterans for their service. In addition to active duty participants (over 600 total riders), many riders are disabled.

This year, Phil Kabatt participated in his 4th ride, dedicating his ride to his father Leo Kabatt, longtime Links resident who passed away in August 2015. Leo was responsible for arranging the crane and the huge U.S. flag billowing over the road as the riders passed by the Links in 2015. The Links community has continued this tradition in 2016. Kudos to Cecelia and Steve Gregory for generously donating the crane and flag set-up and the Harney Volunteer Fire Department for their participation!

Tee It Up Fore Jen Golf Tournament

On April 21, 2016, the Links at Gettysburg hosted the "Tee It Up Fore Jen" Golf Tournament in honor of Jennifer LeVan to benefit the Adams County Arts Council (ACAC). The 1-day charity event, organized by Stu Kravits with a number of Links volunteers, including contributions by many local businesses, raised over \$8,000 for the ACAC. Incidentally, the winning team from the golf tournament



was made up of all Links residents, including Jerry Dougherty, Gil Clark, Neil Harrington, and Tony Strickland. Way to go, guys!

About HOA Fees at the Links:

Here is some information to help new homeowners to sort out the difference between Links HOA and Master Association fees, which can be confusing to some.

HOA (for your neighborhood HOA)

The HOA fee for owners of single family houses at the Links varies slightly for each neighborhood, from \$155 to \$165 per month, due on the first of each month. Checks should be sent to the your HOA (i.e. the Villas at the Retreat HOA, Courtyard HOA, etc.), 601 Mason Dixon Rd., Gettysburg, PA 17325. Alternative payment methods may include automatic e-banking or quarterly/semi-annual/ annual pre-payments.

Master Association Fee

The Master Association fee is paid annually with an invoice from the Master Association mailed to homeowners at the beginning of each year. The amount is currently \$383.16 and is paid to the Links Master Association, mailed to 601 Mason Dixon Rd., Gettysburg, PA 17325. The Master Association fee pays for the management of all community amenities that have been constructed by the developer and turned over to the Master Association, including—but not limited to—insurance, administrative expenses, funding of capital reserves for repair and/or replacement of various common elements and other management-related costs.

Community Amenities Fee

In addition to the Master Association annual fee, all residents pay a Community Amenities fee of \$300.00 per year for maintenance of facilities As part of settlement payment of \$3000, new build residents have a three-year exemption from this fee. Three years from settlement, this fee will be added to homeowner's annual Master Association fee billing.

NID

In addition to HOA fees, there is a Neighborhood Improvement District (NID) annual fee of \$1500.00 payable to Mt. Joy Township to retire bonds that were issued by Mt. Joy Township to cover financing of streets, storm water drainage systems, street and courtyard lighting, common area landscaping, and various other elements of the Links Planned Growth Community. For additional information about the NID, please see the Public Offering Statement (POS), a document that homeowners received at settlement. The NID invoice sent by Mt. Joy Township refers to the NID as a "Special Assessment", which can be confusing. Incidentally, the POS is the foundational document on which Links

governance is built. Also, the IRS is not clear as to whether this NID fee is treated as a tax and therefore deductible. So, please consult your tax advisor with regard to this issue.

These fees and assessments are in addition to local taxes, which, hopefully, can be addressed in a future Links Newsletter article.
