<u>Links Billiards League Completes</u> <u>Another Fun Season</u>

The Links Billiards League wrapped up its season on the evening of March 22, with Mark Maginnis emerging as champion of the season ending tournament.

League play began, as it has since 2010, on the first Wednesday evening following January 1. The game is 8-Ball, and 25 players played a total of 862 games over the course of 10 Wednesday evenings. The emphasis is on fun and camaraderie, but of course there's also a bit of scorekeeping. Gil Clark took regular season

honors with a 64% winning record, followed by Mark Wivell, Andy Muenzfeld, Mark Maginnis, and Bruce Terry rounding out the top five.

Following the regular season, 14 players participated in two evenings of double elimination singles play. Mark Maginnis beat Andy Muenzfeld in the exciting final match, with Mark Wivell placing third and Dennis Bowman fourth. A 1-night consolation tournament held the following week for those unavailable for the regular tournament saw Bruce Terry defeat Steve Rice in the finals.

Next up for the League is an opportunity to improve skills during singles play on four Wednesdays in October. This is an informal affair with no record keeping. It's a good opportunity for league veterans to knock off the summer rust and for new players, experienced or not, to get involved with the league. There are plenty of chances to pick up some pointers from the more experienced players. For information about October play, contact Andy Muenzfeld.

After the holidays, we look forward to the fun and competition of regular League play over the winter months. We always hope to be able to expand the number of players in the League but can't do so without the gracious support of those who volunteer to host League games. The coming year looks promising since it appears that the number of available tables may expand to about 14 from last season's 11. Water Exercise Classes at the Community Center Pool

Once again, Connie Feldman is offering water exercise classes at the Community Center pool, beginning Tuesday, June 13, at 10:30 am. This class is FREE for any Links resident who is over 14

years old. The water is the perfect exercise venue for those of us with joint issues. Class activities will include a mix of cardio, resistance training, balance exercises, and stretching. You can remain in the shallow end for the entire class or venture into the deeper area for the cardio portion. You will not need to put your face or head in the water unless you fall in. Weather (and schedule) permitting, class will be held in our pool on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, **10:30-11:45**.

Here's what you'll need for class:

- Two regular-sized pool noodles. Most dollar stores, Walmart, and Target sell them.
- Sunscreen
- Hat
- Sunglasses
- A plastic bottle of water (No glass at the pool)
- Water shoes (optional, but very helpful for support and a little extra resistance), and
- A desire to get some exercise, have fun, and visit with your neighbors!

As always, please get your physician's approval before beginning this (or any other) exercise class.

Community Center Updates

Community Center Pool Opens for Summer

Your Community Center Oversight Committee is proud to announce the opening of our pool for the 2017 season on Saturday morning, May 27. The pool is open daily from sunrise to sunset. No one is permitted on the pool deck after sunset. A lot of hard work has gone into preparing the pool and hot tub for a super season of fun! Please read the attached pool rules and share them with your guests. As a team, we would like to share a few notes from the rules with you:

- 1. Please remember to bring your white keycard with you each time you visit the pool as ALL entrances to the pool deck are pass card protected.
- 2. Our lifeguard/pool attendant Kat will be at the pool on weekends and holidays and will monitor the sign-in sheet. Please note that Kat has the authority to clear the pool in the event of inclement weather. Please respect her authority.
- 3. Absolutely **NO GLASS** of any kind is permitted on the pool deck.
- 4. **No smoking** of any kind, including e-cigarettes, is allowed on the pool deck.
- 5. Please dispose of all trash generated by you and your guests when leaving the pool.
- 6. As a homeowner, you may invite a small number of guests to join you at the pool, but please remember that your physical presence is required whenever you have guests at the pool. It is a violation of our pool rules for you to invite guests, including extended family members, to the pool when you, yourself, are not there. We make an exception to the guest policy for Links homeowners' adult children who physically live at the Links.
- 7. No child under the age of 14 years, regardless of status, may be unattended at the pool.
- 8. Guests may not invite guests.

- 9. The hot tub is for the enjoyment of adults, and its use by children, although allowed, is discouraged. At all times, children shall defer to adults who wish to use the hot tub. If a homeowner opts to allow a child to enter the hot tub, the homeowner, himself or herself, must be physically at the edge of the hot tub. Absolutely no toys are permitted in the hot tub.
- 10. It is no longer acceptable to leave toys at the pool; if you do bring toy items to the pool, please take them home with you when you leave.
- 11. Please ensure that any child who is not toilet trained is wearing a swim diaper.
- 12. Adults are welcome to use the grill as they see fit. Please remember to turn it off when you leave.
