## LINKS WINTER BILLIARD LEAGUE:



The Links Billiard League concluded its regular season of doubles play on February 28th. After nine weeks of spirited 8 -ball competition, the player emerging with the best won/loss percentage was Gil Clark, with a .670 mark. He was followed by Andy Muenzfeld, Mark Wivell, Tim Dehan, and Bill Obreiter.

Instead of a tenth week of doubles play, a new element was introduced to wrap up the regular season. Twelve players split into two teams for the first Links Cup. This was a Ryder Cup type match between Team Mason and Team Dixon, with a mixture of singles and doubles play. Team Mason emerged victorious thanks to a spirited performance by team Mason's duo of Ken Mutzabaugh and Steve Rice, who defeated Bruce Terry and Lee Fortenberry 10-5. This more than offset one-point victories by Team Dixon in the other two matches.

Every year the Winter League offers a post season Singles Tournament. The double elimination tournament was held this year on March 14 and 21. The eight players who made it through to the last night included Clark, Andy Muenzfeld, Mark Wivell, Tim Dehan, Bill Obreiter, Rice, and the rookies, Thornberry and Michael Pastick. The eventual winner was Steve Rice, who came back from an early loss to Michael Pastick (voted Rookie-of-the-Year) to win the losers bracket. He then faced Andy Muenzfeld from the winner's bracket. Steve won the first match, 3-1 forcing another match with Andy that he won 3-2. The League, which has been running annually since 2010, is directed by Gil Clark, with much assistance from Andy Muenzfeld. The next formal playing session will begin in October.

## World Team Sports "Face of America" Bike Ride



The morning of April 29 at approximately 11:00 am, 600 riders with around 150 wounded/disabled veterans will pass our Links community while participating in the World Team Sports "Face of America" bike ride. This two-day ride originates in our nation's Capital and proceeds to the first stop in Frederick, Maryland. The second day the ride proceeds on the back roads to Gettysburg and always passes the Links community on Mason Dixon road.

This will be our 10th year that we as a community have turned out to say "thank you" to these veterans, many of whom are disabled, as well as the active duty and civilian participants ( 600 plus total riders). We appreciate the veterans and active duty participants for their service to our country and have demonstrated that as the attached picture illustrates.

The bike ride participants have all said that passing through the Links on the second day and getting such a great reception with so many flags has been an inspiration to them, and one they look forward to after a long ride through the back country from Frederick to Gettysburg. ## NEWSPAPER RECYCLING AT THE LINKS:

Newspaper recycling started in 2006 when many families were moving in, making new friends and exploring the local area. Several families took the opportunity to visit Mason-Dixon Farm for a tour. We were told that they were in constant need of newspapers to be used in their birthing barns. Links residents started to collect newspapers to be sent to the Farm via a Boy Scout troop located in Gettysburg and then later in Littlestown. The Farm recently stopped the practice of using the papers, but the Scout troop found another business that needed papers that
 was willing to pay them. The papers now go to a company located in Hanover that uses the shredded paper for padded envelopes.

The money they received goes to defray the cost of running the Troop as well as helping supplement individual activities. Our monthly contribution amounts to about $1 / 3$ of what they deliver to this business. Our efforts are welcomed and appreciated. We help them with their finances and we reduce our carbon footprint. Everyone is a winner.

Product pick up is once a month, usually the third Friday. Products that they will take besides newspapers, include glossy advertisements, magazines, catalogues, phone, paperback and hard cover books, and paper used for packing.
