#### **Master Association Update**

Spring.

**Pool Area**. Thanks again to Mary and Bill Thompson for stepping up to manage the pool this year. Please see their update article. It is imperative that we all follow the pool rules for everyone's safety. We have had instances of glass bottles and other glass items being brought into the pool area. This is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN as a safety item. Broken glass creates a severe safety hazard and will result in closing the pool until completely cleaned. **Water Tower:** The repainted tower and Links logo were completed this



**Handicap Parking Spaces by Pool.** Three handicapped parking spaces have been installed by the Pool behind the Community Center. Parking signs and markings will be installed the week of 24 June. These spaces are for use **ONLY** by people displaying handicapped license plates or valid state - issued permits.

**Safety.** Homeowners are reminded to be extra cautious of pedestrians, especially children within our areas and roadways. It is now summertime and our children are out of school. Please **SLOW DOWN** when driving throughout our neighborhoods.

**Pets.** Pet owners are required to keep their pets on a leash and not let them run free throughout the neighborhood or golf course. Pets must remain on a leash even if pet owners are nearby. Pet owners are also responsible for cleaning up after their pets. This clean-up includes when the pets use any vacant lots. Please be considerate pet owners and cognizant of lawn areas. We have experienced excessive areas of brown spots primarily due to pet urination. We all love our pets but must be aware of ownership responsibilities .

## **Around the Links**

**Cumberland Crossing.** Construction has recently commenced within the new Cumberland Crossing Development. These homeowners will be a separate HOA and a part of the Master Association. They will pay Master Association dues and therefore will have access to Links amenities.

**Note:** We are trying a pilot feature with the Courtyards to showcase news within the various communities of the Links. All Links' Homeowner Associations are encouraged to contribute in future editions. It is an excellent opportunity to update ongoing efforts and welcome new owners.

#### **Courtyards Update**

**New Plantings.** Many of you have noticed the new plants on Todd, Chamberlain, Lookout Courts and fronting Clubhouse Drive. The plants consist of maple shade trees, dogwoods, spruce and various shrubs for landscaping the utility boxes. The Developer provided these in accordance with Phase 1C of the Mount Joy Township's approved Development Plan for the Courtyards. Once planted, this completes the Developer's obligation for landscaping of developed lots. New homes will be landscaped once constructed. Plants are being installed per the locations and plant type as identified in the Plan with only minor variations as to location due to utilities. They must be planted where approved on the Plan. We have no authority to switch from one area to another.

**Lawncare.** The adverse weather, primarily caused by excessive rain, has created havoc for our lawncare provider with long, wet grass and excessive weeds in the mulched beds, driveways and sidewalks. We have met extensively with them to resolve ongoing issues and are confident that drier weather and better-quality control will result in improved service.

**Lighting.** New LEDs will be installed at the Courtyards similar to what was done at Battery Ridge. Installation should commence later this month. The developer installed 8 new streetlights in Chamberlain Court. The streetlight's fixture shade will be replaced so that it will be consistent with the other streetlights.

**HOA Fees (Courtyards Homeowners Only).** Twice a year- as of 30 June and 31 December-Courtyards homeowners will be notified of any under/over payments of Homeowner Association Fees. The notification will be sent via e-mail with a recommendation on how to address the balance. Please ensure your e-mail address on the neighborhood directory is correct. Those with balances as of 30 June 2018 should receive their e-mail circa mid-July. Thank you in advance for your immediate response to our e-mail.

# **Upcoming Community Activities**

#### The Links at Gettysburg Community Pool



Our beautiful pool opened successfully over the Memorial Day Weekend. We want to thank all of the community volunteer residents for their assistance on pool setup day. It took only 45 minutes to get the furniture, lounges, and umbrellas washed and put into place. We were so impressed with the diligence everyone displayed.

Much was completed this season to upgrade the pool. Our contractors worked diligently to make the opening a success. They have completed successful renovations of the pool deck on time despite the weather, completed Phase 1 of the hot tub resurfacing, providing new jets and fixing tiles. The

new handicapped parking spots have also been completed. Fence nettings were placed on the upper deck wrought iron fence to eliminate debris from getting on the pool deck. The fountains have been fixed and are now running and pumps re-inspected and fixed as appropriate. In addition, we have put processes in place for the pool and hot tub, which include statements of work for our pool contractor and lifeguard. We have also, upgraded the pool rules and regulations to assist with pool and hot tub safety.

Our new lifeguard, Sage Craver, is making himself known at the pool. If you haven't met him, please stop by and introduce yourself. In addition to his Red Cross Lifeguard Certification, Sage is in the process of completing Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) training. We are very happy to have him on board.

We would like to remind everyone to be sure you have read the rules and regulations and to be sure to complete the form for large parties if you plan on having one. #### <u>Links Homeowners Social Committee – 4th of July Get Together</u>

The Links Homeowners Social Committee will be sponsoring a **July 4th picnic poolside**. Festivities will start at 4pm for social hour and food will be served at 5pm. Set up and decorating volunteers are needed at 3pm.

Cost is \$5 per adult, \$3 for ages 5-12, and under 5 is free. For this cost, we will provide burgers, hot dogs, chicken sausage, condiments, and paper products. In addition, we ask each family to bring a potluck side dish, snack food, or dessert to share. Since we are poolside, all dishes must be in plastic, paper, or aluminum containers (makes for easy clean up too). No glass is allowed poolside. If it rains, we will serve the food upstairs in the community center.

This is a bring-your-own drink event, but we will have water available. All drinks must be in plastic, paper or aluminum containers. No glass is allowed poolside. We will have an area set up on the grassy side to store wine bottles for fill up into plastic glasses or carafes. You are welcome to

bring your own coolers. You are also encouraged to bring additional folding or lawn chairs for your comfort.

#### NEWSPAPER RECYCLING AT THE LINKS

Newspaper recycling started in 2006 when many families were moving in, making new friends and exploring the local area. Several families took the opportunity to visit Mason-Dixon Farm for a tour. We were told that they were in constant need of newspapers to be used in their birthing barns. Links residents started to collect newspapers to be sent to the Farm via a Boy Scout troop located in Gettysburg and then later in Littlestown. The Farm recently stopped the practice of using the papers, but the Scout troop found another business that needed papers that was willing to pay them. The papers now go to a company located in Hanover that uses the shredded paper for padded envelopes.



The money they received goes to defray the cost of running the Troop as well as helping supplement individual activities. Our monthly contribution amounts to about 1/3 of what they deliver to this business. Our efforts are welcomed and appreciated. We help them with their finances and we reduce our carbon footprint. Everyone is a winner.

Product pick up is once a month, usually the third Friday. Products that they will take besides newspapers, include glossy advertisements, magazines, catalogues, phone, paperback and hard cover books, and paper used for packing. Please do NOT send wrapping paper, shredded paper (bills, etc.), envelopes or cardboard. POC is Frank Negro.

#### FACE OF AMERICA RIDE





Adaptive athletes from across North America, Puerto Rico and Europe participated in the national non-profit World T.E.A.M.'s 16th annual <u>Face of America</u> bicycle and hand cycle ride to historic Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, April 28-29. The annual two-day journey presented by Capital One includes retired and active duty military, civilians and first responders who join in this inclusive cycling event to honor military veterans who have been injured or disabled in their national service. Nearly 100 adaptive veterans and civilians are participating in the ride, covering 112 miles from Arlington and 136 miles from Valley Forge. Many of these adaptive athletes live with amputations, paralysis, blindness, Post-Traumatic Stress and Traumatic Brain Injuries.
