### Courtyards Update

The Courtyards HOA Executive Board has received numerous positive comments with the services provided to date from our new contractor, Atlantic Management Group. They have completed a thinning of the large pear trees and removed all old mulch from our mulch beds and even edged the beds with a spade to ensure sharp edges. They are scheduled to install new mulch by the end of March and commence mowing in April.

In an effort to resolve the ongoing issue with vehicles cutting corners too close and damaging our sod, we have contracted to expand the pavers around selected corners within the area. Hopefully, this will resolve our long standing problem.

A new contract has been signed with the golf course for continuing curbside pickup of our trash at the same price as the older contract. The new contract is for three years and will carry us through 2023. Negotiations are ongoing with the Golf Course for irrigation services throughout the Courtyards areas. We are optimistic we can reach an agreement for a fair price with the golf course for these services.

The Links has a parcel of land by holes #6 and #7 that Rick Klein has allowed our residents to plant gardens on plots approximately 20 by 30 feet. The bike ride participants have all said that passing through the Links on the second day and getting such a great reception with so many flags has been an inspiration to them, and one they look forward to after a long ride through the back country from Frederick to Gettysburg.
